# BIGGLESWADE TOWN COUNCIL Annual Statutory Meeting 16<sup>th</sup> May 2023 General Power Competence Report

# **Implications of Recommendations**

## Background

Officers submitted a report on the General Power of Competence at 10<sup>th</sup> January 2023 Town Council meeting. Members resolved that the Town Council met the specified eligibility criteria for the General Power of Competence and a subsequent resolution would be required at the next Annual Statutory Meeting.

The Council RESOLVED (10<sup>th</sup> January 2023) that it wishes to exercise the General Power of Competence under SI.961 of The Localism Act 2011 (Consequential Amendments) Order 2012. Further, that it meets the criteria for eligibility relating to the electoral mandate and relevant training of the Clerk specifically that at least two thirds of the Members of the Council hold office as a result of being declared elected and that at the time of this resolution the Clerk holds the Certificate in local Council Administration and has completed training in the exercise of this power.

# **Conditions of eligibility**

The General Power of Competence (GPC) came into force on the 28th March 2012 under SI.961 of The Localism Act 2011 (Consequential Amendments) Order 2012. The Government's intention behind the legislation was to provide eligible councils the power to take on an enhanced role and to allow them to do things that previously they were unable to do.

The GPC gives local authorities, including eligible local councils, "the power to do anything that individuals generally may do" as long as they do not break other laws. The council needs to ask itself if an individual is allowed to do it. If 'yes' then the council is, normally, permitted to act in the same way. A Council has to be eligible to use the GPC.

## How to become eligible to use the power of general competence

## Resolution

The Council must resolve at a meeting that it meets the criteria for eligibility relating to the electoral mandate and relevant training of the clerk. The resolution can be passed at any meeting of the council, but a further resolution must be passed at every subsequent "relevant annual meeting" for the council to be able to continue to exercise the power. A "relevant annual meeting" is the annual meeting that takes place in a year of ordinary elections, once every four years.

#### **Electoral Mandate**

At the time the resolution is passed, at least two thirds of the members of the council must hold office as a result of being declared elected. This means they should have stood for election, whether at an ordinary or by election, even if unopposed, rather than co-opted or appointed.

#### Qualified clerk

At the time the resolution is passed the Clerk must hold the Certificate in Local Council Administration (CILCA), the Certificate of Higher Education in Local Policy, the Certificate of Higher Education in Local Council Administration or the first level of the foundation degree in Community Engagement and Governance (or successor qualifications) awarded by the University of Gloucestershire. The Clerk must also have completed training in the exercise of this power.

# **Head of Governance & Strategic Partnerships**

The Head of Governance & Strategic Partnerships is also now CiLCA qualified.

#### **Recommendation:**

Members resolve that the Council wishes to exercise the General Power of Competence under SI.961 of The Localism Act 2011 (Consequential Amendments) Order 2012 and that it meets the criteria for eligibility relating to the electoral mandate and relevant training of the Clerk.
