


## BIGGLESWADE'S NEIGHBOURHOOD PLAN CONTINUED...

#### What is a Neighbourhood Plan?

A Neighbourhood Plan contains planning policies, which will be used to inform decisions on planning applications. The Town Council worked with a group of residents and councillors to put together a plan for Biggleswade. The process involved various stages of community engagement and formal consultation and a rigorous examination to ensure that the Plan meets legal requirements. The Plan is now ready for residents to have their say via a referendum.

#### What does Biggleswade's plan include?

- · Helping to ensure that development is well-designed and sustainable
- Designating 15 Local Green Spaces, including Back Meadows, the Jubilee Wood and the allotments, and also protecting the Common and Green Wheel
- Encouraging diversification of the Town Centre, enhancing its vitality
- Supporting employment-related development, subject to considering impacts on residential properties and the local environment
- Protecting the historic environment, including the Conservation Area in the town centre, and supporting the sensitive use of listed buildings
- Providing better facilities for cycling and walking and mobility scooters, and ensuring proper access for emergency vehicles
- Encouraging the development of community, sports and recreation facilities, particularly football, and seeking further land for allotments

#### What happens if the plan receives a majority "yes" vote?

If successful at referendum, the Neighbourhood Plan has to be 'made' and becomes part of the statutory development plan, so will have to be considered with the Central Bedfordshire Local Plan and national policy in making decisions on planning applications. If the Neighbourhood Plan is rejected, only national and Local Plan policies will apply, as at present.

#### Where can you read the full Neighbourhood Plan?

The Neighbourhood Plan can be viewed on the Town Council's website and printed copies are available to consult at the Town Council offices on Saffron Road.

## PUBLIC WORKS LOAN CONSULTATION

The Town Council would like to thank everyone who responded to the Public Works Loan consultation. The majority of respondents approved of the Town Council applying for a Public Works Loan to fund transformational works throughout the town.

If the application is successful, the funding from the Public Works Loan will allow the Council to create a high-quality environment with green spaces to promote healthy lifestyles and help improve the physical and mental wellbeing of residents.





Over the course of five years, the Town Council aspires to use this complimentary funding to update, maintain and transform recreation space.

More information will be shared in the near future.

This investment will help improve social inclusion through investing in public spaces.

The Town Council will allocate funding to increase the number of allotment plots available to Biggleswade residents.









## COUNCILLOR GRANT FAGE

### **Town Mayor**

As of May 2022, Biggleswade Town Council welcomed Cllr Grant Fage as Mayor of Biggleswade (2022/23).

Cllr Fage joined the council in 2017, serving as Deputy Mayor and Chairman of the Town Centre Management Committee. He has always had an active role in the Council, most notably for leading on several complex planning applications. Since taking on the new position, Cllr Fage is actively supporting various charities. Cllr Fage will be hosting a curry night this September (2022) in aid of his nominated charities.



Cllr Fage said: "It's a tremendous honour to accept this position as Mayor of Biggleswade and be able to represent the town at such a crucial time. Over the coming decades our town will face enormous change - the choices ahead of us as councillors, and the decisions that we make, will shape Biggleswade for a long time to come".

The Council also offers a 20% discount for local charities & not for profit organisations who would like to book a space at the Orchard Centre.



# THE PUBLIC REALM TEAM



The Public Realm Team maintain green spaces throughout the community.

Earlier this year, the Public Realm Team, together with the Biggleswade Rotary Club, planted a range of new flowers on the Sainsbury's bridge.

The Public Realm Team strim grass, plant and water flowers, maintain hedges and complete litter picking throughout the areas that the Town Council manage. The team plan on reviewing the waste management procedures at the allotments and aim to find a more ecological means of waste transfer.

## **NEWS & UPDATES**

#### **CCTV** Provision



Biggleswade Town Council has agreed a new and improved CCTV strategy that would see the installation of eight fixed cameras and two mobile cameras across the Town Centre. Locations have been decided based on the analysis of crime statistics and feedback from residents. The Town Council recognises the immediate need to improve CCTV infrastructure with the increased crime rate, particularly within the Town Centre. Funding is currently being reviewed in collaboration with Central Bedfordshire Council.

#### **New Benches**

In 2021, the benches in the Town Centre were extensively re-furbished. The work included painting and sanding the benches, as well as replacing pieces of wood where necessary.

A second bench has also been installed at the old Buttercup Mead Play site.



#### War Memorial



Biggleswade Town Council recently completed painting works at the War Memorial. With thanks to Corinthian Stone, the cenotaph and the names of the fallen have now been restored to full glory.

The War Memorial is now ready for our annual Remembrance Sunday Event.
