BIGGLESWADE NEIGHBOURHOOD PLAN REFERENDUM

The Neighbourhood Plan passed referendum on 6th October 2022.

The Biggleswade Neighbourhood Plan was formally adopted by Central Bedfordshire Council on 17th October 2022.

The Neighbourhood Plan now sits alongside the Local Plan prepared by Central Bedfordshire Council and the National Planning Policy Framework as a legal planning document. The policies within the Neighbourhood Plan will be used to decide future planning applications for Biggleswade.

Cllr Madeline Russell, Deputy Mayor of Biggleswade and Chairman of the Biggleswade Neighbourhood Plan Strategy Group, commented "I am delighted that Biggleswade residents have welcomed the Plan. The Strategy Group has worked hard for over four years to create policies which will ensure that the best of Biggleswade is preserved as the town develops".

Cllr Grant Fage, Mayor of Biggleswade, said "This is a resounding vote of support for a Plan which gives Biggleswade a greater say over how planning applications affect our town."

Biggleswade Town Council wish to thank everyone who voted.

PUBLIC WORKS LOAN



Overview of updates

Biggleswade Town Council have secured a £425k loan from the Public Works Loan Board which will be invested in a range of capital infrastructure projects.

Franklins Play Area Regeneration Update

The works to our flagship Recreation Ground are expected to commence from December 2022 and are due to be completed by Spring 2023. The project will create a completely regenerated space for everyone to enjoy.

All play equipment will be replaced with new age-appropriate fully inclusive equipment. A large amount of landscaping will be completed to deliver attractive zones within the Recreation Ground. Access for all will be secured by improving the main gates.

A tender exercise has been completed, a preferred supplier has been nominated, and a detailed plan has been signed off.

Further details will follow as the project gains momentum.



Further updates regarding the Public Works Loan are coming soon.

Drove Road Chapel Update

This project will return the Chapel to its former glory. The contractor is installing scaffolding and securing the site in December 2022.









Allotment Improvement Works

The Town Council will be investing in improvement works at the Kennel Farm Road Allotment Site.

The Council will be developing the west side of the site by landscaping the existing mounds, removing the composting bays and delivering fifteen new half allotment plots. The Council are working to provide an effective solution to the flooded half plots on the east side by installing new micro planters and completing additional landscaping.

The Council will provide regular updates through social media postings.

PUBLIC REALM TEAM

Biggleswade Town Council's Public Realm Team continue to play an important role in the upkeep and maintenance of public areas in Biggleswade. Some of their key duties include grass cutting and weeding, football pitch marking and pavilion cleaning.

The team recently completed the installation of new flower bedding to a range of areas within the town.

The team continue to complete: The weekly inspections of many play areas within Biggleswade, Ensuring the smooth-running of interments at Stratton Way and Drove Road Cemetery, Erecting gazebos for the Saturday and Tuesday Markets, Litter picking at various locations within the town, Emptying and maintaining the Council's car park machines, and Opening and closing the tennis courts and the Century House public toilets.

During the autumn and winter months, the team complete additional leaf clearance and pruning works in the many green areas throughout the town. Their work provides for more attractive areas and better services for residents and visitors to enjoy.

An application has recently been submitted by the Town Council to erect a Commonwealth War Graves Commission entrance sign at Drove Road Cemetery.
