COMMONWEALTH WAR GRAVES COMMISSION PLAQUE UNVEILING CEREMONY



On Friday 17th March 2023, the Commonwealth War Graves Commission Plaques at Drove Road Cemetery were officially unveiled.

The plaques commemorate the nineteen Commonwealth servicemen buried at Drove Road Cemetery who passed away in the First and Second World Wars to help ensure they will never be forgotten.

The ceremony was officiated by Rosemary Bentley, of St Andrew's Parish Church, The Reverend Martin Ceaser, Biggleswade Baptist Church, and The Reverend Leslie Noon, Trinity Methodist Church.

The ceremony was attended by members of the Biggleswade Royal British Legion, Biggleswade Town Councillors and Officers, and Mac MacDonald from the Commonwealth War Graves Commission.

Franklins Recreation Ground

Biggleswade Town Council is pleased to announce that the transformation work carried out at the flagship Franklins Recreation Ground play and leisure space is now complete. The recreation space is now open for all of the community to enjoy.

Biggleswade Town Council extends its thanks to the external contractors and the Public Realm Team for all their hard work in turning this vital outdoor space into a welcoming and fit-for-purpose space for all ages and physical abilities to enjoy. The new wood and steel play equipment will serve the children of Biggleswade for many years to come and with over 1400 plants and trees installed by the Public Realm Team giving the area a fresh look, we hope to see this area play host to a larger number of visitors this year than ever before.

Franklins Recreation Ground is the first of a series of Play Areas that are being redeveloped as part of the wider Play Areas and Green Spaces Project. As of May 2023, Franklins Recreation Ground and Buttercup Mead redevelopments have been completed and announcements for future plans will be forthcoming in the near future.

Drove Road Chapel

The Town Council are pleased to confirm that Phase 1 of the Drove Road Chapel restoration works have now been completed. This has seen the repair of ventilators, re-glazing windows, re-pointing bricks and repairing stonework.

The Town Council are now in the process of beginning Phase 2 works which will include window and joinery repairs, french drain installation and redecoration.

This is predicted to be a 3-year-project.

ABOUT THE ORCHARD

The Centre consists of two main rooms:

Main Hall

The Main Hall is approximately 13 x 20 metres, with vinyl flooring and a high ceiling at 5 metres. Its maximum capacity is 120 people depending on use. The hall is available for classes, meetings, functions and parties.

Training Room

The Training Room is approximately 7.5 x 9 metres. Its maximum capacity is 40 people depending on use. The room is available to all organisations and businesses in and around Biggleswade for training purposes and meetings.

Biggleswade Market is held within Biggleswade's popular and well-visited Town Centre, surrounded by over one hundred different businesses, shops and eateries.


Biggleswade is a thriving and rapidly expanding town with a current population of 23,000. Furthermore, the town has easy access to the A1 and is situated 40 miles north of London and 20 miles south-west of Cambridge with good rail links to both cities.

There is also free parking on Saturday in all of the Town Council managed car parks which attracts further visitors to the Town Centre.

The Town Council erects gazebos for the Biggleswade Market to make it more convenient for stallholders.

Coronation Big Lunch 7th May 2023


